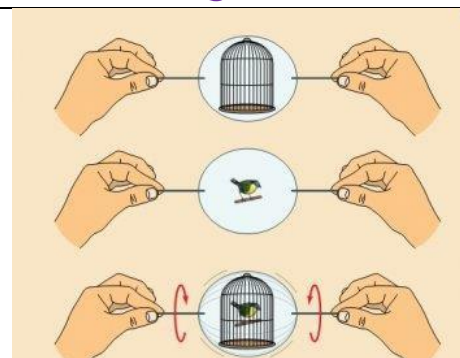

| modern | Modern means relating to the present time |
| present | You use present to describe things and people that are around now |
| bygone | Bygone means happening or existing a very long time ago. |
| past | The past is the time before the present, and the things that have happened. |
| Victorian | Victorian means items used or events which happened when Queen Victoria was on the throne. |
| thaumatrope | A toy in which partial pictures on the two sides of a card appear to merge when the card is twirled rapidly |
| homemade | Something that is homemade has been made in someone's home, rather than in a store or factory. |
| manufactured | To manufacture something means to make it in a factory, usually in large quantities. |
| maze | A maze is a complex system of passages or paths. |
